Mobility Study Finalized

At the April 19th Neighborhood Meeting, the outcome of the Mobility Study workshops was presented.

There were many areas of concern; traffic speeding, pedestrian and bicycle safety, and street lighting. Along with sidewalks in some areas and increasing the tree canopy in others. These concerns were broken out by the degree of interest in each and the effect to our overall neighborhood. The final Mobility Master Plan will appear shortly on www.shadybanks.org.

The following three (3) areas were determined as the ranking priorities.

- ♦ 17th Avenue entrance / SW 12 CT.
- ♦ 18th Avenue from SW 14 CT. south to 17th Street / SW 14 CT. by park
- ♦ 15th Avenue

This Study is a working document and priorities can change as needs evolve.

The implementation of change to these areas will be determined by availability of funding. There is an initial amount of \$50,000 to begin with. The balance will come over time through grants and other sources.

The success of grant funding is largely predicated on the amount of participation a Civic Association has, this is demonstrated by its membership. The greater the participation, the more it shows the buy-in by residents.

This is where we appeal of those Shady Banks residents who are not members. An annual dues of only \$10.00 adds up to a show of strength. If you haven't already joined please do so now. A form is on the last page.

At our April 19th meeting, Officer Ivan Fernandez, Fort Lauderdale PD, informed us about a new program being implemented called vision Zero.

Currently Florida leads the country in pedestrian deaths. A multi-pronged approach is being put to work in Fort Lauderdale to combat the circumstances that lead to pedestrian injuries and or death.

Expect to see more traffic enforcement: speeding, rolling through stop signs, running red lights, reckless or careless driving and the biggest bugaboo, DUI.

Pedestrians will be cited for jaywalking (yay), bicyclists for not obeying traffic rules.

Bottom line, mind your Ps and Qs behind the wheel, on foot, or pedaling.

Hurricane Prep

Yep, it's that time again-the advent of hurricane season. June 1st to December 1st is like waiting for the other shoe to drop. Weather-persons come into the spotlight, we suddenly become entranced by steering currents, disturbances off of Africa or in the Caribbean. Then the inevitable happens, something begins to form, gets a name, and now they really have our attention. An abundance of models start to "project the track" and the "cone" is no longer something that holds ice cream. Going off to the North Atlantic, great. Heading up the coast beyond Florida good. Aiming here? No Way.

Worse case happens and our area is in the "cone". Being prepared will make the possibility of a hit easier to endure. Waiting till the last minute, fighting through grocery stores for water and provisions, going to Home Depot for batteries and plywood just plain bites the big one. Each year you tell yourself you won't wait till the last minute and yet there you stand in an aisle waiting for more H2O to be unloaded, scouring the shelves for something to eat that doesn't

need refrigeration. Here's a partial list of stuff you can do ahead of time that will make life simpler if a storm is imminent. And you will always be able to use if we escape the season storm-less.

Water—1 gallon per person, per day. Same if you have pets. FEMA wants us to have enough for 3 days.

Food-non-perishables. There are a lot of choices, just make sure doesn't require heating. No electric; no stove, microwave, or can opener.

Gas-in the car and gas cans if you have a generator, chainsaw, etc. Take a moment to start the generator or chainsaw to make sure they will work if needed.

Batteries-radio and flashlights and camping style lanterns. Candles okay but be careful.

Valuable Papers-insurance, medical, etc. Some type of waterproof container.

You can charge your cell phone using the car but you need the right adapter.

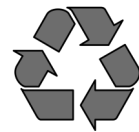
Remember to make sure your family has an emergency plan: where to meet if separated.

Also at the April 19th neighborhood meeting, the topic of using *nextdoor.com* to share alerts of strange activity in the neighborhood came up. Officer Fernandez advised the following: **if you feel yourself, or another person is in danger or property is at risk your first call is 911.** *Nextdoor.com* is an outstanding tool but does not replace the police. Calling a neighbor or officer of the Civic Association first does not replace the police. Calling the police first increases the chance the person(s) causing your concerns will be caught.
